Meeting was called to order by Chairman Donald Schneider with Howard McCormick, Mark Turner and Ron Berges present in office. Vickie Sandlin, Julesburg Advocate joined the meeting via zoom.

Schneider moved to approve the agenda with the addition of a report mowing county roads and Roop settlement under new business. Turner second, carried.

The August 16, 2022 payables were reviewed. McCormick moved to approve the August 16, 2022 payables. Turner second, carried.

Turner moved to approve the August 9, 2022 minutes as presented. McCormick second, carried.

Discussion was held about questions on mowing the county roads. Rick Furrow is wanting to wait one month but the Board thinks that will be too long.

Discussion was held on the accident at the landfill. The loader hit a pickup owned and driven by David Roop.

Lori Ehmke, Treasurers office and Eva Contreras, Assessor, joined the meeting. Ehmke brought up discussion about how to get a county credit card without the personal information of the employee being used to get it. It is possible to get a corporate credit card but the county would have to pay a large annual fee. The Board and guests will look into this matter to find out more information. Contreras then gave the Board a raise request for Elmer Ruder for review. The Board will discuss this in a work session and will get back to Contreras. Ehmke and Contreras left the meeting.

Schneider told the Board he will be gone for next week's meeting.

McCormick moved to approve Building Permit #2022-09 for Turner second, carried.

Schneider moved to approve Subdivision Exemption for Blochowitz LTD for Turner second, carried.

Turner moved to approve Subdivision Exemption for Lyle Blochowitz for McCormick second, carried.

The Board reviewed the attorney letter concerning the accident at the landfill. The county insurance will not cover the repairs to the pickup due to governmental immunity and due to the fact that the employee running the loader was on his cellphone at the time of the accident, the county will reimburse the cost of repair with the signature of Mr. Roop releasing all liability from the county. McCormick moved to approve the payment in the amount of \$8,475.06 with the signed letter. Turner second, carried.

Discussion was held on the CIC contracts for the finance portion and the public works portion. McCormick moved to approve the CIC contracts. Turner second, carried.

Rob Crowder, Civil Defense, joined the meeting. Crowder updated the Board on current projects including a grant that would pay half of the salary of Josilyn Lutze for her help and three applications he is working on for Ovid Fire building and for Ambulance. Crowder told the Board that he had a site visit for EMPG on the 21st and that it went well. Crowder asked that a work session be set up to discuss livestock emergency planning. Crowder then told the Board that he will be gone the 6th, 7th and 8th for conference and he will be gone for a week beginning on the 11th. Crowder left the meeting.

Rick Furrow, Road & Bridge, joined the meeting. The Board told Furrow that they signed the settlement letter and paid Mr. Roop and that a policy will be in place as a one and done in the future if an accident happens and a cellphone is involved. Furrow left the meeting.

The meeting has now reconvened. McCormick moved to have an independent contract with Elmer Ruder at an extra \$2.44 per hour and to pay out of county admin for IT support until the end of this year. Turner second, carried.
