
Turner moved to approve the agenda as presented. McCormick second, carried.


Schneider started discussion about the Sedgwick County COVID Variance Phase 2 explaining this will allow gatherings of up to 50 people while following CDC guidelines for social distancing, non-essential travel can resume, all other businesses can open that are not currently open including the drag strip. Businesses will need to maintain 6-foot physical distance in common areas where employees are likely to congregate. Ongoing Prohibitions include services to high-risk populations and visitation to hospitals and senior living facilities. Church openings are in Phase 3 of the variance. Nick Goshe reported that there are still no positive cases in Sedgwick County. Sheriff Britton reported that he and his deputies have done random business checks during Phase 1 and there has been no business out of compliance.

McCormick moved to approve moving into Sedgwick County Variance Phase 2 beginning immediately. Turner second, carried.

McCormick moved to include churches in Phase 2. Turner second, carried.

Turner moved to adjourn the meeting. McCormick second, carried.
